


RUGBY FLASHMOB

The fanzone is the official place in Gloucester to watch the match if you haven't got a ticket. It is open 18 September–11 October.

The site is **FREE** entry but capacity is limited so entry will be on a first-come-first served basis. Watch the games on a big screen, in a 'Kingsholm from Home'. The fanzone will take the appearance of a mock rugby ground, complete with grandstand and an artificial pitch. Food and drink will be available plus official merchandise and match day programmes. The Rugby World Cup trophy will be visiting the fanzone **11am-1pm** on **Friday 25 September** for photo opportunities. In Mariners Square at the Docks, visit the family Zone – a fun-filled area with lots of 'have a go' sporting activities to take part in. All activities **free**. Under 16's must be accompanied by an adult.

The family zone will open on all fanzone days and closes at 6pm each night. **Please note** there will be bag checks on entry, so please don't bring your own alcohol.

Gloucester Cathedral is a short walk from the fanzone and dominates the city's skyline. The 1300 year old architectural masterpiece has been the backdrop to Hogwarts in the *Harry Potter* franchise, *Doctor Who, Wolf Hall, The Hollow Crown* and *Sherlock*. The ground of the Cathedral also accommodates the house of the Tailor of Gloucester which, is today, a charming museum.

Gloucester Docks is Britain's most inland and best preserved Victorian port. The area is a popular destination for shopping, restaurants, cafes and waterfront bars, and plays host to the Gloucester Waterways Museum and the Soldiers of Gloucestershire Museum.

Close by, the **city centre** boasts a wide range of independent restaurants and pubs, plus high street shopping on offer throughout the gate streets, and in Gloucester's multiple shopping centres.

Visit the **Gloucester City Museum**, and the **Folk Museum** which host the 'WOW! Rugby' exhibition and the Mini Scrumpty Trail respectively.

Strike A Light Festival runs 7-14 October which brings amazing new performance to light up the city of Gloucester and kindle the best local talent.
